#### **BIRDING BASICS**

Summertime is a great time to get out and go birding, so let us learn from an expert.

The library will present a program on local birds with Dr. Dennis Kirkwood on **July 17th at 6:30PM** 

Dr. Kirkwood is a native Harford Countian who still lives on his seventhgeneration family farm known as Newark Farms. Holding degrees from McDaniel College, Northern Illinois University, and the University of Maryland, his first serious encounter with birding was with a college level course in his graduate years. He is the past president of the Harford County Bird Club and a member of several environmental associations. He and his wife Jean have conducted birding trips throughout the New World Tropics and within the United States. Dr. Kirkwood has documented birds on seven continents, identified five "first sightings" and 303 different species of birds in Harford County. Dr. Kirkwood will share his knowledge at this Third Wednesday Series program.
